1. Need to have design journals subscription.	<i>TIP has partnerships with NED University of Engineering & Technology that give access to design periodicals and publications. TIP actively encourages teachers and students to take part in academic symposiums and industry conferences where they may network with professionals, show their work, and learn about the most recent developments in textile design technology.</i>
2. Need to have proper internet bandwidth in Design Department.	<i>Despite the institute's financial constraints, TIP recognizes the value of having access to pertinent resources for both academic and professional development. Currently, TIP provides online databases that cover a wide range of issues in textile design technology, allowing students to conduct research and stay current with advancements in the industry.</i>
3. Need to hire more full-time faculty. Currently, they have only 2 full-time faculties.	<i>TIP strives to provide high-quality education and ensure a supportive learning environment for all our students. TIP acknowledges that the number of full-time faculty member may be limited at present, our existing faculty members are experienced and dedicated professionals who are committed to delivering a comprehensive educational experience. In addition to our core faculty, we collaborate with external experts, industry professionals, and visiting faculty who possess specialized knowledge and practical experience in textile design. Their involvement ensures that our students receive exposure to the latest industry trends and best practices Despite the current financial limitations, TIP management is actively seeking qualified and experienced individuals to join our faculty in the Textile Design Technology program.</i>

Although TIP aims to provide faculty with competitive remuneration packages, we acknowledge that there may be circumstances in which our pay scales are somewhat lower than those of other institutes. TIP is currently addressing this issue. Since TIP recognizes the value of investing in our faculty members and the influence their knowledge has on the general standard of education.</i></p>
